

Dear Friends of St. Barbara Monastery,

Somewhere in the reminiscences of pilgrims who visited St. Seraphim of Sarov, there is the following not only wise but "revolutionary" word of advice from the Saint—a rare treasure and gift to us especially now as we begin Great Lent.

A gentleman stopped at Sarov to see the Saint and, confessing he was given to anger no matter how hard he tried to control himself, asked for help.

This is St. Seraphim's reply: When you sense anger arising within yourself, immediately PAUSE, STOP, and ask yourself: 'What is the Lord trying to show me? What is He trying to teach me?'

With these inward thoughts, at once, everything changes! Your anger subsides. Calling to mind that the Lord is at work for your salvation, which He always is, and asking His help to understand what has just happened, where anger was rising within you, it is now miraculously reversing, giving way instead to thanksgiving to God, Who is always doing all He can to bring you to your senses and to salvation. (Try this and see for yourself!)

The even more encouraging fact of the matter is that this teaching of St. Seraphim about anger can be extended to all the passions, i.e., all the sinful tendencies that assail us. The moment one catches oneself tempted by whatever it might be, PAUSE, STOP and ask inwardly: 'WHAT IS REALLY GOING ON HERE? What is the Lord trying to show me about myself? What is He trying to teach me?' Instantly, what is going on is seen in a new light—the light of salvation.

During the Great and Holy Fast before us, the Church will sing daily "GOD IS WITH US!" May we, one and all, be acutely aware of this in the midst of our efforts throughout the Forty Days!

Our good friends, Jerry Reich and Aristotle Rivera, helped unload the contents, and our monastery librarian, Sr. Photini, has begun the process of sorting through the boxes—finding treasures along the way.

HOMELESS MINISTRY UPDATE

Sister Ioanna is continuing her ministry to homeless men and women in Santa Paula and in Los Angeles as part of her life as a lay sister here at the monastery.

Locally, she is the case manager for five people she met at Spirit of Santa Paula, a nonprofit with a homeless shelter, a street outreach ministry and a Drop-In Center for people who live on the streets of our town. Case management involves gaining a person's trust and helping them connect to funding and services that will help them move out of homelessness. She has been able to help three of them receive an income and find temporary housing while they wait for permanent housing. The other two men still live on the streets. One is schizophrenic and not able to cooperate with medical and mental health services. The other man, Philip, was connecting with medical specialists when, unfortunately, he was struck by a car in January. He suffered broken bones and a brain injury and is still hospitalized. Thanks be to God, he is now conscious and able to communicate. Please pray for him.

After a two-year hiatus due to Covid restrictions, Holy Virgin Mary Cathedral in Los Angeles has begun anew the St. Xenia Outreach Ministry to their homeless neighbors. Bringing much needed items such as blankets and socks, each month Claudia Funke (chairperson) and Sister Ioanna lead a small team of parishioners to minister to those living on the streets in the Silver Lake area of Los Angeles. They look forward to building relationships there that will, God willing, lead to healing.
